This multifaceted landscape necessitates a nuanced understanding of security that transcends traditional paradigms, advocating for comprehensive policy solutions that address the interconnectedness of these issues and promote sustainable governance practices in the region. MRPC is open to papers based on primary data and or secondary data provided they speak to current and futuristic public policy concerns in the region.

Submission Guidelines

Upon the approval of research abstracts, authors shall be expected to follow these guidelines for the commentary submission.

- Originality: Your paper should be original work, not previously published or under review elsewhere.
- Author Information: Include your full names and affiliations in your submission email for identification and correspondence purposes.
- Review Process: MRPC is committed to a fair and unbiased selection process through a double-blind review, ensuring the anonymity of both reviewers and authors.

Key Requirements

- References: While brief, commentaries must cite relevant literature, reports, or data where applicable. Use APA 7th ed referencing styles consistently.
- Format: Submissions must be in Word (docx) format with standard 12-point Times New Roman font, 1.5 spacing.
- Structure: We propose a simple structure that would include an introduction, several sub-headings to structure the thesis, and a conclusion. Nb. Please see our commentaries on the MPRC website for guidance.
- Author Details: Include the author's full name, affiliation, and contact details on a separate title page to ensure anonymity in the peer-review process.
